Tobacco Retailer,

Wisconsin Wins is part of a comprehensive approach to preventing youth access to tobacco. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services contracts with local partners to conduct investigations to establish retailer compliance with the law.

The Fond du Lac County Health Department working with "Five Counties for Tobacco-Free Living Coalition" conducts random tobacco retailer compliance checks. These checks are authorized by Wisconsin Statute §254.916 and help Wisconsin be in compliance with Federal SAMHSA SYNAR Program. SYNAR mandates states to maintain a compliance rate of less than 20 percent of tobacco sales to minors or risk losing \$10 Million in Federal Substance abuse prevention funding

Vape shops will also be included in the random checks as well as taverns. Under state statute minors are allowed to enter a tavern for the purpose of a scheduled tobacco retailer compliance check when working with the Wisconsin Wins Program.

Free on-line employee training is available at www.witobaccocheck.org . After passing the on-line exam the employee will receive a certificate of completion that will meet state statute requirements for employee training.

Although employees complete training, periodically reviewing tips to increase their ability to identify a minor's ID and avoid mistakes can increase their ability to refuse a sale to a minor. Under FDA requirements, all tobacco retailers must check the photo ID of anyone under the age of 27 who attempts to purchase any tobacco product.

It is the goal of the "Five Counties for Tobacco-Free Living Coalition" to help tobacco retailers and their employees be successful in keeping tobacco out of the hands of minors. We offer educational resources and training tips to ensure employees ask for and know how to read a Wisconsin driver's license correctly.

SUGGESTED TRAINING TIPS

It is the business owner's responsibility to ensure that their employees complete tobacco retailer training and have proof of completion of the training in the employee's file. Free on-line employee training is available at www.Wltobaccocheck.org. Passing the on-line exam will provide the employee with a certificate of completion that will meet state statute requirements for employee training. Even after the employee has completed the mandated training regularly reviewing tips such as those below could help the employee successfully deny a sale to a minor.

- ❖ Ask for a photo ID for anyone who appears to be under the age of 27 who asks to purchase a tobacco product per FDA regulation as of June 22, 2010.
- ❖ Look at the person handing you the ID to make sure the photo matches the person presenting the photo ID.
- ❖ Look for Wisconsin Driver's License/ID cards in a **vertical format** for those **under 18 and 21 years of age**.
- ❖ Identify the **month, day, and year** that the person turns 18 in a **yellow box** or listed under their picture.
- ❖ Do **NOT** rely solely on a "Calendar" or the register. If the register beeps after scanning the ID or entering the person's date of birth **DO NOT override the cash register**. Look at the ID again instead of assuming you made an error.
- ❖ Confirm the reason the cash register is beeping, is it because the person is a minor?
- ❖ Ask for help from a co-worker or manager if you have trouble identifying the age of the person requesting tobacco.
- ❖ Selling any type of tobacco to minors is illegal, which includes but is not limited to candy flavored tobacco products, e-cigarettes containing nicotine, or nicotine juice.
- ❖ Deny a sale to a minor by stating "I cannot sell tobacco to you, you are not 18 years old".
- ❖ Protect yourself, a violation is punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00 for the first offense; and between \$200.00 and \$500.00 for the second and subsequent violations within 12 months.
- ❖ Practice asking for an ID, practice identifying a minor's ID, and practice refusing the sale.
- ❖ These training tips are not meant to be all inclusive.

DIFFERENT DESIGNS? SAME DEAL.

Wisconsin's vertical IDs don't always look the same, but they mean the same thing: **your customer may be under 18. Here's what you should do:**

- 1 Look for the dates under their photo.
- 2 Check the date they turn 18. Is it in the future?
- 3 If it's in the future, they're not old enough to buy tobacco. Don't make the sale.
