A Welcome Note from City Manager Joe Moore

Welcome to the first issue of our new City newsletter! Summer is just around the corner and with so many positive things happening across our City, we want to connect our residents with all Fond du Lac has to offer.

We've included a number of City updates throughout this newsletter, including dates for key initiatives, special events and City celebrations. But, because there is so much to do, be sure to check out the <u>Recreation Department's 2023 summer brochure</u>, the <u>Downtown Fond du Lac Partnership Newsletter</u>, and the <u>Senior Center Newsletter</u> - among many others.

New this year, we'll be experimenting with the voluntary implementation of No Mow May. We've seen a national trend of suspending grass and weed control requirements to help support pollinators coming out of hibernation. Pollinators play a pivotal role in the vitality of our food supply, and letting lawns grow longer for a few weeks ensures plenty of options for nectar and pollen. We'll want to hear from the community about renewing this initiative next year.

Regardless of when your mowing season begins, remember to collect your cut grass and other yard waste to prevent it from blowing into the street and storm drains which eventually end up in Lake Winnebago. Our <u>yard waste drop-off site</u> on Doty Street is always a good alternative.

We are eagerly anticipating the reopening of the Lighthouse Peninsula this summer after the completion of several improvement projects. By the way, this June marks the 90th anniversary of the opening of the Lighthouse in 1933.

These activities and services couldn't be done without the help from City employees and community partners. Because of their hard work, Fond du Lac is a thriving community, and we are excited for you to experience everything there is to do around the City this summer.

Construction Updates

Our Engineering staff are busy on various construction projects. Look for big changes on Lighthouse Drive along with parts of Ledgeview, Division, Third, and Warner streets. These projects represent an over \$6 million investment in the community. Timelines on these projects will vary: Lighthouse Drive is set to be complete before Memorial Day while the additional projects will be completed by October.

Our <u>Adopt a Drain program</u> is a great way to help prevent street flooding while keeping our waters clean.

Water Utility

Along with quality drinking water, the Water Utility provides a number of <u>services to residents</u>, including starting or stopping service, pool filling and emergency support. Be sure to <u>visit our website</u> for ongoing system maintenance updates.

We offer <u>online bill payment</u>, or you can pay your bill in person at the City County Government Center.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our City wastewater treatment plant treats waste from not only City residents and businesses, but also from surrounding communities. The Village of North Fond du Lac and parts of the Townships of Calumet, Empire, Fond du Lac, Friendship, and Taycheedah send their waste to the wastewater plant for treatment. This accounts for about 30% of our plant flows.



Parks

We are gearing up for warmer months! It takes 11 full-time and more than 20 seasonal staff to maintain and keep our parks in great shape. This year, plan your next event at the Pavilion in Lakeside Park - which is great for events with up to 150 people.
