PROJECT GOALS

#1 Create and Enhance Public Green Space

Improvements to existing and new public spaces along the river corridor will activate the riverfront

#2 Provide Aesthetic + Structural Improvements

Replacement and rehabilitation of river walls will provide a safety and aesthetic improvement in the corridor

#3 Consider Flooding + Water Clarity

Providing potential design solutions and recommendations for moving forward with mitigation techniques

#4 Provide Safe Access to the River

Accessible and safe access to the shoreline through fishing nodes, overlooks and canoe/kayak launches will yield safer access for site users




RIVERFRONT FLOOD MAP

Goal: aesthetic and safety improvements

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STAKEHOLDER AND INITIAL PUBLIC INPUT – DESIGN CHARRETTE

Other


- Some larger event/plaza gathering space

- outdoor **entertainment**
- accessible access for people of all ages and abilities
- historical elements/signage

- splash pad
- chess tables



IMPLEMENTATION RECOMMENDATIONS

Maintenance Items

- Provide adequate trash and recycling receptacles at water access points and public space
- Start clearing and grubbing of **overgrown shorelines** – beware of structural concerns and erosion control
- Prepare Maintenance Plan
- Treat invasive plants along the shoreline and introduce native vegetation

Action Items

- Partake in watershed analysis to consider water capacity/storage upriver from project area
- Initiate conversations with the DNR for feasibility of development of closed sites

Safety Items

- Identify **safety concerns** in conversation with emergency services.
- Identify locations for seawall ladders and access for emergency services equipment
- Distinguish crosswalks for pedestrian safety and invest in Rectangular Rapid-Flashing Beacons.
- Initiate formal **structural analysis and review** of existing river walls and embankments to determine replace/repair plan

Aesthetic Items

- Introduce Lighting: for safety and aesthetics
- **Signage:** Wayfinding, Water Trail, Educational
- **Seating:** Benches and seating areas
- Integrate Public Art
