

PHOTOGRAPHING MINORS:

Per §948.14, you may not photograph a minor without the written consent of the minor's parent, legal custodian, or guardian. The written consent shall state that you are required to register with the Sex Offender Registry.

NON-COMPLIANCE:

Failure to comply with the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry is a Class H felony. Penalties include up to a \$10,000 fine, up to 6 years in prison or both.

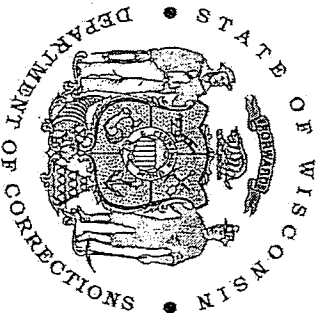

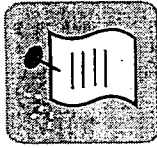

Information for the Registered Sex Offender

You must keep the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry informed about where you live, where you work or volunteer, where you go to school, and any e-mail or instant messaging identifiers.



WHAT TO REPORT:

You must tell the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry if you:

- Move or change your residence
- Start working
- Stop working
- Start volunteering
- Stop volunteering
- Start going to school
- Stop going to school
- Maintain any websites for personal use & names of such websites
- Use e-mail, instant messaging & identifiers used

If you are confined to a county jail or a prison for any length of time, you need to notify the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry of your confinement location and again when you are released.

If you move out of Wisconsin, you are still required to keep your registration information up to date with the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry **and** with the new state.

WHEN TO REPORT CHANGES:

If you are on parole, you must report any changes to the Sex Offender Registry before the change.

If you are not on parole, you must report **any** changes in your information to the Sex Offender Registry no later than 10 days after the change takes place.



HOW TO REPORT INFORMATION AND CHANGES:

You may telephone, mail, e-mail or fax your information to the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry. 1-888-963-3363



After the information is received, a letter to confirm the information will be mailed to you. You must sign, date and return all letters by mail within 10 days.

Even if you report your change of address to the United States Post Office, you still need to notify the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry of your address change.

Anyone on supervision needs to get permission from his or her probation/parole agent before any changes are made.

REPORTING HOMELESS:

If reporting homeless, and you are not on probation or parole, **You must call and speak with a staff member of the Sex Offender Registry or designated Registry**

Specialist every seven (7) days, on a business day, to report "homeless" status and the location(s) in the city and state where you have been frequenting and sleeping for the previous seven (7) days, and plans for the next seven (7) days along with all other required registry data. If possible, you must also provide an emergency contact person and telephone contact number for the purposes of contacting you should you fail to report every seven (7) days.

REGISTRANT ON SCHOOL PREMISES:

Per §301.475, a person required to register as a sex offender can only enter a school premise if the school district administrator or his or her designee or the governing body of the school has been notified of the specific date, time, and place of the visit and of the person's status as a registered sex offender. As a registrant, you must notify the school prior to being on the property.

NAME CHANGE:

Per §301.47, you may not change your name or identify yourself by another name while on the Sex Offender Registry. If you intentionally violate this law, it is a Class H felony.

WORK OR VOLUNTEER WITH CHILDREN:

Per §948.13, registrants convicted of a serious child sex offense [see §948.13(1)(a)] may not work or interact primarily and directly with children under 16 years of age. If you violate this law, it is a Class F felony.
