Happy National Senior Center Month!

The National Council on Aging has announced that this year's Senior Center Month theme is "SENIOR CENTERS The Key to Aging Well". When I started to think about what this means, a lot of different things came to mind. What is "Aging Well"? What role do we play in that? And are we doing what we can to encourage people 50+ to "age well"?



I believe that aging well is paying attention to the 8 dimensions of wellness — social, physical, emotional, spiritual, occupational, intellectual, financial, and environmental. When I look at our programs and activities, each of them is directly related to one of these dimensions - most encompass two or more — how awesome is that! I believe we are working hard to encourage people to age well — and I hope that you feel that way too. Our Senior Center is what it is because of YOU!

Here are some interesting facts:

- In the United States, nearly 11,000 Senior Centers serve over 1,000,000 people a DAY! A MILLION!!!!
