Senior update.



Listen in for information about upcoming activities and events at the Senior Center each Monday when Cathy Loomans, Senior Center Director, joins Spencer Wagen on Fond du Lac Today. Over the next couple of months, we are going to be offering some programs that I hope you will consider attending. The topics aren't "fun", they aren't lighthearted, they aren't the kind of things that will make you walk away with a smile on your face. But we wouldn't be doing our jobs if we didn't provide programs that addressed serious issues – issues that affect many of the people that we serve – your friends, your neighbors, people that you care about, or maybe even you.



The topics of these programs center around financial preparedness and elder abuse. This month's topic is Elder Abuse. What is elder abuse?

From the National Council on Aging, the types of elder abuse include:

• **Physical abuse** means inflicting physical pain or injury upon an older adult.

• Sexual abuse means touching, fondling, intercourse, or any other sexual activity with an older adult, when the older adult is unable to understand, unwilling to consent, threatened, or physically forced.

- Emotional abuse means verbal assaults, threats of abuse, harassment, or intimidation.
- Confinement means restraining or isolating an older adult, other than for medical reasons.
- **Passive neglect** is a caregiver's failure to provide an older adult with life's necessities, including, but not limited to, food, clothing, shelter, or medical care.

• Willful deprivation means denying an older adult medication, medical care, shelter, food, a therapeutic device, or other physical assistance, and exposing that person to the risk of physical, mental, or emotional harm—except when the older, competent adult has expressed a desire to go without such care.

• **Financial exploitation** means the misuse or withholding of an older adult's resources by another.

The statistics around elder abuse are frightening. Elder mistreatment has been recognized as a largely hidden public health problem that affects over one in ten older adults each year, or roughly seven million people aged 60 and older in the U.S.

90% of abusers are family members or trusted others.

Almost one in ten financial abuse victims will need to turn to Medicaid as a direct result of their own monies being stolen from them.

Cognitive impairment and the need for help with activities of daily living make victims more vulnerable to financial abuse.

This month I would encourage you to come and learn more about this important and sensitive topic. Our hope is that we can help you identify what elder abuse looks like, and hopefully protect you or those you care about from becoming a victim. And please know that we are always here to help get you in touch with the appropriate resources if you believe that you or someone you care about is being victimized.

Also this month, we will be participating in National Healthcare Decision Day by having an educational session on the Power of Attorney for Healthcare as well as an opportunity for you to work through the document with a social worker.

Next month is Financial Literacy Month and Money Smart Week. We will be having some important and informative programs related to finances and aging. Next month's newsletter will have more information on these important programs.

Thank you for understanding the importance of these programs – hope to see you soon!

REAL ID INFORMATION

Beginning October 1, 2020, anyone planning to fly (even within the United States), visit a federal building, or visit a military base will be required to show identification that is REAL ID compliant (or show another acceptable form of identification, such as a passport). With this new Department of Homeland Security program, standard issue driver's licenses used as a form of identification will no longer be accepted for domestic air travel within the United States.



Depending on the itinerary and method of travel for our Happy Travelers trips, our travelers

may be affected by this new requirement. Does your driver's license have the star in the corner as indicated by the red arrow on the sample license above? If not, please read on to find out more information about the Real ID.

What is Real ID?

According to the Department of Homeland Security, The REAL ID Act establishes minimum security standards for license issuance and production and prohibits Federal agencies from accepting for certain purposes driver's licenses and identification cards from states not meeting the Act's minimum standards. The purposes covered by the Act are: accessing Federal facilities, entering nuclear power plants, and, boarding federally regulated commercial aircraft.
