Thank you for supporting the Friends of the Fond du Lac Senior Center, Inc. "The Friends" as we tend to call them, are the 501(c)3 non-profit organization that does all of the fundraising to support the programs and activities at The Center.

As some of you may know, the City of Fond du Lac covers the operating expense of our beautiful Center. The city budget does not, however, cover any of our program or activity expenses - here is where The Friends come in! If we need supplies, whether it's for an art class, a delicious food event (like September's ice cream bar), or fun prizes for our giveaways (the monthly birthday winner, our kindness box winner, or the "Guess How Many" contest), The Friends provide those. They support our classes that have a paid facilitator by offsetting the facilitator fees so that we can keep the prices of our classes extremely reasonable. They are also the force behind the purchase of larger items - things like all of the envelopes for the jigsaw puzzles, the 900 monthly greeting cards that our Outreach volunteers write each month to residents of local senior living communities, and the wonderful exercise equipment that we have available for anyone to use.

The Friends do several fundraisers each year, the "Friendship Drive" - our annual campaign/membership drive, the annual Raffle Fundraiser, the Annual Gala (which will be coming up on the 8th of this month!), and the Dine Out and Service Books. They are a vital part to what we are able to do here at The Center. If it wasn't for them, and your support of The Friends, we wouldn't be able to offer the wide variety of programs and activities that we do.

I wanted to mention The Friends for a couple of different reasons. The Annual Gala is coming up on the 8th of October. This is a FUN night - food, music, dancing, fellowship, and fundraising. All of the proceeds from the event go to support The Center. I invite you to join us! This year's event is being held again at the Moraine Park Conference Center. We will be having a taco bar, catered by Beans & Bites from North Fond du Lac. We have worked with Beans & Bites for several events and their food and DESSERTS are amazing!
